State Testing Updates: Grades 3-8

The Montana Aligned to Standards Through-Year (MAST) Program features a series of short, standards-aligned math and ELA tests that are administered throughout the year. **The third testing window will be open from March 30th through May 22nd.** The goal of this assessment is to develop a system that provides timely and relevant feedback for teachers and students, as well as comparable summative data for education leaders. Along with this, students in Grades 5 and 8 will participate in the annual administration of the state Science Assessment this spring. Food Allergies

The breakfast and lunch program at Highwood School is nut-free. The school building itself is not a nut-free zone. However, the school is committed to keeping the building safe for all students by prohibiting food in common areas. If your child has a food allergy and plans to eat breakfast or lunch at the school, the school is required to have documentation of the allergy (from a medical professional) to keep on file. When birthday or party treats are provided in the classroom, students must choose from the list

Under federal law, virtually all men must register with the Selective Service within 30 days of their 18th birthday. The Selective Service System also accepts early submissions of registration information by 17-year-old men. 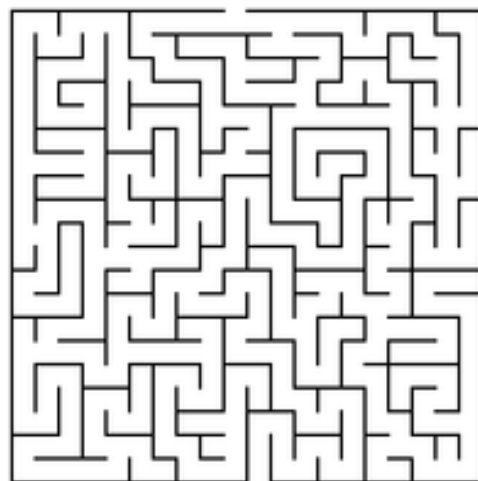

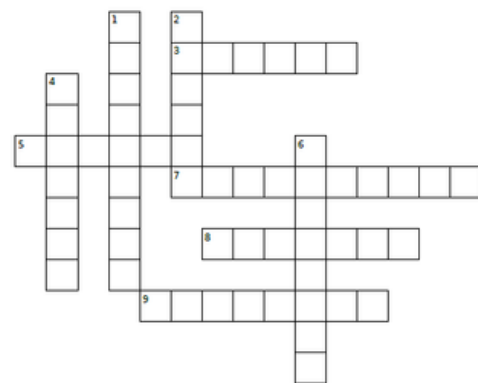

Crossword of the Month



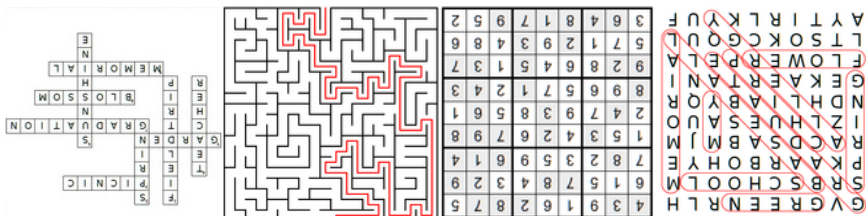

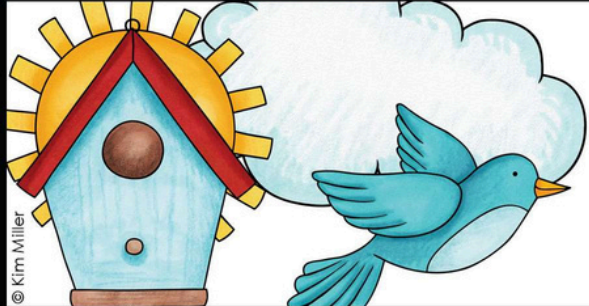
